Dragons Abreast ACT is tickled pink to announce that the 2011 DA ACT Dragon Boat Challenge raised an amazing \$40,000 for local and national groups supporting women on their breast cancer journey. Funds were distributed at the Regatta wind up on Thursday 10 November as follows:

- \$18,000 <u>Dragons Abreast Australia</u>, our national organisation supports 44 groups providing many opportunities for dragon boating following breast cancer treatment
- \$7,000 ACT Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group, provides practical support to women undergoing treatment in our region
- \$5,000 Otis Foundation to support a program where women can spend free R&R time at a lodge in Thredbo with family or friends while undergoing treatment Otis Foundation | Breast Cancer Network Australia
- \$4000 Palliative Care in the ACT for training volunteers. Currently, there are five women with breast cancer at the Hospice
- \$1000 Breast Cancer Network Australia our umbrella body providing Advocacy and the <u>My</u> <u>Journey Kit</u> to all newly diagnosed women www.bcna.org.au
- \$5000 Dragons Abreast ACT & Region to support our local group and encourage and support breast cancer survivors with getting on the water.

The Australian Government announced it will accept PBAC recommendations to list new drugs on the PBS and will review its listing processes over the next 12 months. A number of other drugs that have been recommended by the PBAC since February will also be listed from 1 December. These include the breast cancer drug **Xgeva (denosumab)**, which is used to treat bone metastases in women with secondary breast cancer.
