How about you have a try at sweeping?

Sweeping is fabulous fun. We need to have a few more up and coming sweeps in training. Currently, we have four licensed sweeps (Marion Blake, Frances Heaney, Robyn Chen and Susan Pitt) and Donna Lennon is a sweep in training.

You may just want to be able to sweep our club out on our lake in gentle conditions for training. Or, you may want to sweep an international crew in an international regatta. Talk to our coach, **Frances Heaney**, about giving sweeping a try when you are out on the lake one quiet day.

If you want to work towards getting the hours up to take the sweep test then Frances will obtain a training log from the DB ACT sweep coordinator, **Debbie Whitfield**.

After you have done enough hours, and Frances thinks you are ready, you will sit a written test and a practical test.

About sweeping

The sweep is able to steer with an almost unobstructed view of the surrounding area during training, regattas, festivals and is able to monitor conditions at all times in and outside the dragonboat, including other watercraft so as to avoid collisions, observing the direction of travel, wave and wind conditions.

Sweeping a boat has similarities to driving a car, where the crew are the engine, brakes, and gearbox (forward and reverse gears). The sweep is the steering wheel who maintains control and balance, following the direction of travel by using peripheral vision at all times and eyeing the surroundings within the training area.

Eurostars paddle in Dragons Abreast regatta in Canberra

European Union and Member State representatives have joined hundreds of Canberrans in the annual Dragons Abreast Regatta on Lake Burley Griffin. European Union officials and representatives from 14 Member States delegations have teamed up to form the Eurostars crew to compete at the Dragons Abreast Regatta held on Lake Burley Griffin in Canberra on Saturday, 14 October.

The community event raises awareness about breast cancer and featured 18 crews and hundreds of competitors.

For the second year in a row, the Eurostars dominated the Division B final to cross the line first (just!). The Eurostars crew was beefed up this year by the inclusion of six heads of European missions, the highest number of ambassadors and high commissioners to ever paddle for the EU crew in the regatta that raises awareness of breast cancer. The Eurostars crew included the new EU Ambassador to Australia, Michael Pulch. 'The Eurostars victory was an example of the European Union operating at its best', Ambassador Pulch said.

'This win came after EU officials teamed up with Member State representatives – including Heads of Missions from Greece, Czech Republic, Cyprus, Austria and Hungary - to face up to a challenge, overcome adversity and enjoy success!' The Eurostars also won the Division B final last year while in 2015 the crew finished second in Division B after an on water collision with another

There were murmurings among the Eurostars crew to begin training in January to make a tilt at the Division A final in 2018!


Quentin Bryce to address Canberra women

No Medicare rebate for Oncotype DX test

The Oncotype test is a diagnostic tool that can help guide treatment decision making by providing women and their doctors with information on whether chemotherapy would provide any benefit compared to other treatment options, such as hormone therapy. It is most commonly recommended in women with low risk breast cancers where the benefit of chemotherapy is unclear. The test analyses 21 genes within the tumour and makes a prediction of the likelihood of breast cancer returning, and whether or not chemotherapy can reduce the risk of this happening.

A recent Australian study found that 24 per cent of women were able to avoid chemotherapy and all its toxicities after having the Oncotype test, which showed the risk that their breast cancer would recur was low.

BCNA Director of Policy and Advocacy Danielle Spence said that failure to approve this test will mean that into the future some Australian women may receive chemotherapy for very little benefit.

BCNA is very disappointed with this decision by MSAC. Being able to give women every possible opportunity to make informed decisions about which treatments may be best for them is incredibly important. Avoiding chemotherapy and of all the associated toxicities and long term side effects can make a huge difference to the lives of women with breast cancer,' Danielle said. 'It can also mean less time away from family and work'. 'Without a Medicare rebate the Oncotype DX test will cost Australian women up to \$5,000, which we know is out of reach for many. This test is widely available overseas and BCNA wants to see Australian women have access to this important diagnostic tool,' she said.

BCNA has been advocating for the inclusion of Oncotype DX testing on the MBS for a number of years. You can read the <u>organisation's submission to the MSAC here</u>. We will be contacting the Minister for Health to discuss our concerns around the MSAC decision and its impact on Australian women diagnosed with breast cancer.

'Gene tests like Oncotype DX are the way of the future and we want to make sure all Australians have access to them so we can catch up to the rest of the developed world,' Danielle said.
