Chinese New Year 2009 memories

The last time I remember being called a 'first timer' was as I nervously sat waiting for my first chemo infusion and the couple sitting next to me welcomed me to the chemo club. That experience led to another, to DA ACT. This year I was a virgin again — at the Chinese New Year Dragon Boat Regatta at Darling Harbour. I'd simply not experienced 'it'. Not the dragon boat racing, not the camaraderie nor the ceremony that everyone assured me is always just amazing.

When I first said 'I'll go' I had planned to stay with my sister in Bondi and just turn up for the event but then **Bec Karr** was looking for someone to share a hotel room with and I realised that it just might be more fun to do the whole thing. I'm so glad I did. It was a wonderful weekend, beginning with drive time conversation, a memorable evening at the banquet, followed the next day by the marvellous masses wearing pink. My eyes travelled the crowds and my brain went into an overdrive of 'you too, you too, you too — all of us. We are in this together'. For me the races were fun and I loved the salty tang on my lips as water splashed my face. Luckily, doing well in the race wasn't very important to me; but being in it is. Yes.

Yes, and then the ceremony. Old hands (DA Brisbane) generously offered 'first timers' a place in the ceremony, aboard our linked flotilla of dragon boats with our shared experience and understanding - that pink sea of women, and an occasional man, celebrating life and remembering those who have lived and died. It was hot out there. I was squished, thigh to thigh, three on the bench. sweating sun block into my eyes but crying real tears for all who have this path to travel. I looked to the shore and there were more of us. Back on dry land my legs felt wobbly from the sway of the sea but they carried me through, what was for me the most moving part of the day. The paddles raised in a guard of honour. Smiles, encouraging words, high fives, shoulder pats, hands in union. We drove home, four of us, full of our impressions of the weekend and our shared reason for finding ourselves part of Dragons Abreast. It is great to do it together.

Gluten free hot cross buns (for Easter 2010)

1 cup rice flour

2 cups of gluten free self raising flour

1/3 cup of castor sugar

3 teaspoons of xanthum gum

1 teaspoon of baking powder (gluten free)

2 teaspoons of cinnamon powder

2 teaspoons of yeast

1/4 cup of olive oil

3 eggs

1 teaspoon of vinegar

1 cup of sultanas

2 tablespoons of melted butter

Empty of sachet of yeast and add 3 teaspoons of castor sugar. Add a little warm tap water and stir well. Sit it to one side and let it froth up.

Add all the dry ingredients into you food processor and blend 30 seconds. Pour in yeast mix oil eggs vinegar and blend on high for 3 minutes. The mix should form into quite a large dough ball. Tip in sultanas and process till worked through the dough.

Prepare a large baking tray with baking paper. Melt 2 tablespoons of butter and brush tops of the buns cover with tea towel and wait 30 minutes for the buns to rise. Place in hot oven at 190°C and bake for 30 minutes. Eat immediately while warm.

It was a stimulating day with high calibre speakers including Lyn Swinburne, Raelene Boyle,
Associate Professor Fran Boyle and Stephanie
Dowrick. We heard about new diagnostic tests and treatments and strategies to overcome short and long-term effects of breast cancer and so 'live well' beyond our breast cancer experience. Some 300 people surged from the National Library of Australia, buoyed by what they had experienced.

Fran Boyle spoke about long-term issues following treatment. She explained why there was much to celebrate from research and clinical trials and encouraged us by suggesting ways to plan for survivorship. Time available to question Fran was all too short and so many hands were raised. But we did have answers about clinical trial results, genetic testing, Herceptin and possible heart problems, the value of compression sleeves for lymphoedema management as well as scans and tests after breast cancer. Suggestions for keeping our sexual relationships alive raised some chuckles!
