Australian Championships 2010

This year the Australian Championships were held in Adelaide at the AM Ramsay Rowing Course at West Lakes. The feeling of knowing you can complete the distances still in control gives one confidence and a desire to go hard.

We all paddled in the club races and although did not win medals we reached finals in a number of races, losing by a dragon's whisker!
