A couple of months ago a sign at my gym invited ladies to sign up for the Dragons Abreast ACT Social Corporate Dragon Boat Regatta. The gym was getting a team together and I thought why not, this could be fun. It was! I enjoyed myself tremendously and while checking out the opposition online found out about Dragons Abreast. This sounded pretty good to me; I could do something I enjoyed, meet new people and I qualified as I had breast cancer. Yep, this sounded pretty good. I emailed the coordinator and asked if I could come along for a paddle. I felt sure I could do this; I'd had had a go or two with the girls at the gym, no worries.

My first paddle with the Dragon Boats Abreast ladies was at 6:30am. AM — do people really get up that early? It was not quite light and cold. Still, I had put my name down and off I went. There weren't a lot of us so we took out *Gecko*, the baby boat. We got out on the water and before long I discovered that this could be hard work. In a small boat. it's obvious if you collapse or lean over the side and throw up. I was determined to keep going, not one of my smarter decisions. But, it was still fun. BreastScreen ACT

The ACT has one of the highest rates of breast cancer but only 55 per cent of women in the age group 50–69 yrs participate in the free BreastScreen ACT service. This is a great wake up call for women. Spread the word.

Draft ACT research

Claudia Cresswell, BreastScreen ACT and Janet Li provided draft stats below on the higher incidence of breast cancer in the ACT as reported by Dr Helen Zorbas, NBOCC, at the BCNA Summit on 14 August. Janet Li from BreastScreen ACT's Cancer registry is undertaking a review of breast cancer in the ACT that is in draft form. Her findings so far are:

- -The ACT women have a consistently higher median maternal age at the first childbirth
- -The ACT has a higher proportion of childless females over 45 years compared to the national average
- -The ACT women have a higher socio-economic status compared to all other states and territories
- The ACT women have a higher proportion of alcohol consumption at regular or risky level; and an insufficient intake of the recommended daily intake of vegetables
- The ACT women reported a slightly higher proportion of current use of hormonal replacement therapy (2001: ACT: 22.4 per cent; Australia: 21 per cent) (2005: ACT: 15.6 per cent; Australia: 11 per cent)
- The ACT women reported a slightly higher proportion of ever using oral contraceptives compared to national females (1995: ACT: 26.7 per cent; Australia: 20.6 per cent) (2001: ACT: 28.8 per cent; Australia: 26.8 per cent).

NBCF Annual Research Update 2009 - feedback

KISS (keep it simple stupid) is the key to a clear message about breast cancer screening. Australia is the envy of the world with a reduction of 22 to 28 per cent in deaths due to breast cancer. A contentious issue is what happens to women aged 40 to 45 years who will not be covered by the new recommended guidelines for women aged 45 to 74 years? BCNA is advocating for breast screening from 40 years but we all know that mammograms are not efficient with dense tissue. Hopefully, research will simplify breast screening in the future for women in Australia and in developing countries as cancer in 2010 will cause the greatest number of deaths worldwide. The NBCF Research Update format now includes presentations by prostrate cancer researchers who have discovered that there are many similarities with breast cancer such as a similar number of men are diagnosed and die each year from prostrate cancer. This is why KISS is important as a clear message will help men and women be proactive and go to their GPs.

Stem cell research has discovered that it is not the stem cell but the daughter cell (luminal progenitor) that is the culprit in spreading breast cancer. Surprisingly, a vitamin D deficiency may be linked with breast cancer but further research is required.

Exercise and physical activity leads to fitness and diminishes fatigue, anxiety, depression, poor sleep and increased body weight. GPs and health professionals are being urged to encourage newly diagnosed women to continue exercising straight after surgery and during chemotherapy and radiation treatment to improve their quality of life.

These are a glimpse of the NBCF and Prostrate Cancer Foundation research which is happening now due in part to the successful pink ribbon and Movember campaigns. I was boosted by the positive messages and glad to see other BCNA and Dragons Abreast members from around Australia. We need to keep singing from the same song sheet and promoting awareness about breast and prostrate cancer to save lives.
