#### **BCNA Canberra contingent**

Our wonderful breast care nurses attended the SIBCC. ACT delegates included Geraldine Robertson, Patsy Sheales, Gillian Styles, Marion Leiba, Susan Pitt, Vicki Bryne, Haddas Haileselassie and Kerrie Griffin.

BCNA will continue to push for more equitable treatment for all women including those living in remote and regional Australia. Here is a summary of some of the

major issues at this truly inspirational conference. It was great to share with new and old friends.

#### Summary

Survival after a diagnosis of breast cancer continues to lengthen due to:

- Improving technologies to treat cancer
- Better understanding of the disease, its molecular biology, especially the role of DNA
- Developing targeted therapies with new drugs (eg new herceptins) to treat certain types of cancer cells with greater effectiveness-and-fewer side effects. Note: Targeted therapies are also called biological therapies
- Monitoring regularly when on aromatase inhibitors (Als), having regular bone density scans, taking Calcium with Vitamin D and keeping Vitamin D levels up
- Continuing Tamoxifen for 10 years is highly recommended (even after 5 years on Als)

#### Exercise

- Promoting exercise (aerobic and resistance) in recovery following surgery and treatment
- Setting goals and keeping a diary! 180minutes/week of moderate intensity recommended or 30 minutes in 5 days/per week

There is a need for formal integration of exercise into the start of breast cancer follow up care:

- Encouraging clinicians on board
- Funding required
- Making policy change.

### Fat as a store of oestrogen

 Fat stores oestrogen in post menopausal women. For those who aim to reduce their oestrogen levels (via ovariectomy and mastectomy) keeping weight down could have benefits.

Doctors advise the best way to prevent breast cancer is to maintain a healthy weight, limit alcohol and have regular mammograms. However, we did learn that even doing all the 'right things' (eg having children young, breastfeeding them) need have no bearing on our chance of developing breast cancer. It's just bad luck. While some of us carry mutant genes known to increase our chance of developing breast cancer what triggers the cancer to grow needs an answer. Hopefully, one day soon causes will be identified.

#### BCNA Mini Field of Women,

National Arboretum Canberra, 22 October 2012

Thanks and isn't Canberra great! Breast cancer affects many women and men. AIHW date show that by the age of 85, a woman has a one in eight chance of developing breast cancer. Fortunately, for most women a diagnosis of breast cancer does not shorten their life expectancy. In the ACT and SE NSW region, outcomes following breast cancer are as good (if not better) than those reported in national statistics. This is probably due to a high uptake of screening in our community leading to early detection and also because of advances in treatment.

As much as I enjoy the science of oncology and the intellectual stimulation in my work, the factor that keeps me working in this specialty and will do so for many decades to come, is the women that I meet. They are daughters, sisters, friends, mothers, work colleagues. Their strength and resilience and ability to keep everything going in their homes, their work and their personal lives is truly inspirational. I learn so much from them! I often think about the beautiful women I have cared for who have died from breast cancer and I reflect about how things could perhaps have been done better — both during the initial treatments and the management of advanced disease. Thanks again for the invitation. Jen and Lucy spoke so beautifully.

Welcome from the breast cancer team. My name is Jen and this is **Annie O'Neil** and **Sonya Allen**. Together, we are the early breast care coordinators for the ACT and surrounding region. Before I begin, I would like to extend a special thanks to **Collette and John McKay** for their assistance with today's event.

Today is a day to reflect on breast cancer and its impact on our community. To the women who have been diagnosed with breast cancer — we welcome you here today. It is also an opportunity to thank important support groups such as Breast Cancer Network Australia (BCNA), Bosom Buddies, Eden Monaro Cancer Support Group, and the ACT Cancer Council.

While we, the breast care coordinators, provide clinical information and counselling support to women diagnosed with breast cancer, our roles are complemented by the services provided by the support groups. For example, Breast Cancer Network Australia provide specific information that is available from diagnosis — known as the *My journey kit* and, practical post-surgical equipment when appropriate.

Bosom Buddies are another important group that perform multiple roles. From our perspective, one of the most valuable services they provide is their face-to-face patient visits. These are welcomed by patients and, in many cases, help to reduce anxiety. Today's Mini Field of Women has been planted to raise awareness within the ACT community about breast health. Approximately 40,000 Canberrans utilise the Tuggeranong Parkway each day — and it's safe to assume that at least half of those have breasts. #### Breast cancer awareness month

Many women who have been diagnosed with breast cancer are concerned about whether their cancer will come back. An emerging body of evidence suggests that there may be modifiable lifestyle factors which can influence risk of breast cancer recurrence.

- Results of a Cancer Australia survey of members of Breast Cancer Network Australia who have been diagnosed with breast cancer. The survey results allow us to further understand women's knowledge and behaviours in relation to reducing the risk of breast cancer coming back (recurrence)

Prof Zorbas, CEO, Cancer Australia, pointed to the national mammography screening program as a factor, together with increasing awareness of the disease and its symptoms. She said concerns of the cancer's recurrence is a factor that affects survivors but pointed to recent research involving more than 10,000 women with the disease, indicating exercise may help prevent it returning. "Even moderate physical activity was shown to reduce the risk of recurrence by 24 per cent and reduce the risk of dying by more than a third,' she said. **Professor Helen Zorbas, CEO, Cancer Australia**
