

DBACT COVID Safety Plan

This "DBACT COVID Safety Plan" is mandatory and effective from 29 July 2022. It was prepared using ACT Government restrictions (https://www.covid19.act.gov.au/restrictions/current-restrictions).

Statements including the word "shall" are compulsory. Other points are for guidance.

All clubs shall develop and maintain a COVID Safety Plan. The ACT Government may request a copy.

DBACT is open for all activities. This includes training, come and try, regattas etc. Exemptions for large events are no longer required. There are no restrictions on interstate paddlers.

Physical distancing

We do not need to practise physical distancing in the dragon boats. Physical distancing is encouraged at all other times. The following limits should apply in the compound:

- Paddle equipment shed maximum 10 people
- Erg shed maximum 7 people
- Regatta equipment shed maximum 10 people
- Toilets maximum 9 people.

Cleaning, sanitising and hygiene activities

Every Club **shall** bring its own alcohol-based sanitiser to all activities.

Each Club should ensure that all shared equipment (boat gunnels and seats, boat lifting grips, sweep oar handles, drum seat, boat roller handles, safety bags, any DBACT paddles used) are to be sanitised after use.

Cleaning of the toilet block has re-commenced following lock-down.

Manage people with illness

Anyone with COVID symptoms or a current positive COVID test result shall stay away from DBACT.

Compliance and enforcement.

The DBACT Club Representatives and Safety Officers shall ensure these rules are followed.
