



COVID-19 Stage 2 FAQ's

Why two (2) Safe Plans?

The Safe Plan for Queensland Hotels and Clubs will cover licensed clubhouse operations including the bar and restaurant.

The Industry COVID Safe Plan for Outdoor Sports covers the use of the golf course, game, and equipment. It has been prepared by the Department of Sport and Recreation. This Plan is due to be approved by Friday lunchtime.

Are 2 people allowed to ride in a golf cart?

Yes, two people can now share a golf cart.

Can a Club play different types of competitions?

Yes, Clubs are not restricted to playing stableford. Clubs need to comply with government regulations such as social distancing when choosing the type of competition.

Can clubs sell alcohol to take out on the golf course?

If the golf course is licenced, then no, alcohol cannot be sold for consumption on the golf course.

Golf Australia is continuing to seek a change in this requirement for QLD facilities

What is a separate 'defined area'?

A separate 'defined area' is one in which each group of up to 20 patrons is separated from each other. The intention is that if you have separate dining areas, bar areas or outdoor areas, that you may have up to 20 in each, so long as they are separate from each other.

In addition to this, the Queensland Health FAQ states that:

- these patrons must be kept separated from other defined areas by a minimum of 1.5 metres at all times; and they must remain seated and stay in that defined area.
- Remember that you must still ensure you have no more than four square metres per patron on average.

What about communal areas like entries/exits and bathrooms?

At this stage, there is no expectation that each 'defined area' be serviced by separate entries/exits or restrooms. However, where this is possible and practical, then clubs should allow for such.
