

Foundation Lead Umpire Accreditation

Learning Outcomes & Competencies 2023

The Foundation Lead Umpire is the second accreditation in the umpiring framework and is targeted at supporting umpires who want to create positive environments for participants and take the lead on the field. This accreditation is completed in two parts. The first is an online course that can be completed at any time. Then the second is your assessment, which can be undertaken at any level of Full Field or Hockey 5s games. To begin this accreditation, participants must have completed the Safe Hockey Module and the Play by The Rules – Respect for Officials. This accreditation is completed in two parts, the first being the online course which is followed by a face-to-face assessment.

In the event that a competency cannot be observed for practical or logistical reasons, an assessment of knowledge can be performed by the assessor through the appropriate use of questioning.

Learning Outcomes & Competencies are abbreviated to the following:

FLULO15	Describe the role of communication for an umpire including whistle, body, and vocal communication

FLU16	Keeps time accurately

FLU18	Recognises and responds to dangerous play
FLU19	Demonstrates the ability to recognise infringements within tackling
