In our day cigarette smoking was fashionable, grass was mown, coke was a cold drink, and pot was a thing you used for cooking. Rock Music was Grandma's lullaby and AIDS were helpers in the Principal's office. We were certainly not before the differences between the sexes was discovered, but were surely before the "sex change". We made do with what we had, and we were the last generation that was so dumb as to think you needed a husband to have a baby.

No wonder we are so confused and that there is a generation gap.

But we survived; what better reason to celebrate.
