

## Deregistration of Yachting Victoria

2016

- MYA agreed to move towards One Sailing
- YV Committee continued to operate, reporting to the AS board

2018

- NSW voted to deregister and became Regional Advisory Committee
- NSW clubs affiliated directly to AS

2020

- TAS voted to deregister and became Regional Advisory Committee
- TAS clubs affiliated directly to AS

2022

• YV voted to begin the process of deregistration




## What will happen?

- Boatshed: The Boatshed will continue to deliver sailing programs on Albert Park Lake. It will continue to be the office location for Victorian-based AS staff.
- Staffing: No change. In 2016, YVIC staff transferred their employment to AS. AS is committed to maintaining current staffing levels.
- Government Funding: The Government has confirmed that this is not at risk as a result of the proposed changes and that AS will continue to be recognised as the peak body for Sailing in Victoria.
- The YV Board will become the Regional Advisory Committee for Australian Sailing, reporting to the AS Board.



## Process so far



to Deregister

State Sailing Center was transferred into AS name

YV assets will be transferred to AS Completion of outstanding litigation

Application will then be made to cancel the registration of YVIC with Consumer Affairs Victoria

RAC will form

Clubs will be asked to directly affiliate with AS









No Club affiliation fees are used to fund High Performance programs. 100% of HP funding is derived from government grants, sponsors and patrons.





## Personal Accident Insurance Review

- Review underway to ensure that the AS Personal Accident insurance policy is providing coverage that is both relevant and valued by clubs and their members.
- Feedback sought from clubs via a short survey, addressing:
  - The Scope of coverage for the current policy
  - The importance of the elements (Benefits) of the current policy
  - Whether it would be beneficial for individuals to have options to increase scope
- Targeting implementation of changes for 1st July



## Personal Accident Insurance Review

### Survey- Key take outs:


- 60% of club office bearers have limited knowledge of the policy
- Those that have made a claim, have generally had a poor experience
- Club run events and volunteering are the most valued activities to be covered
- Permanent disablement and non-Medicare medical expenses are the most important elements
- 65% of respondents think it would be beneficial for individuals to have options to increase coverage



## Racing Rules of Sailing Rule 46

- RRS 46 implemented on 1 January 2022.
- All crew are required to be a member of a club.

- SailPass is a flexible tool that clubs can use to comply with RRS 46. ie. Introductory membership categories.
- SailPass is not compulsory- it is a resource to support clubs grow their membership.
- SailPass take up continues to grow around the country.
- SailPass does not impact club affiliation fees.





## One Sailing Update.

- Yachting NSW deregistered Dec 2018.
- Yachting TAS deregistered July 2020.
- Yachting VIC deregistration (Agreed at SGM 21<sup>st</sup> February 2022)
- YNSW, YTAS and YVIC clubs supported their votes with >95% in favour
- Yachting QLD and Yachting SA both had a members discussion as part of their Club Conferences.
- Each MYA replaced with a Regional Advisory Committee.
- No loss of votes, status or ability to input into AS strategic priorities.
- It does relieve association officers of their legal responsibilities and liabilities.








#### Gender Balance & Age Breakdown





