



Darryl Clout (NSW) Softball Australia Chairman 2000 - 2004

Darryl Clout's softball journey spanned over 25 years when he took his daughter to her first game of T-Ball. He has been involved with the sport as an administrator and coach at club, state, national and international levels.



Darryl's international career as the Open Men's Team Manager began in 1995 on the tour to New Zealand, followed by the 1996 IX ISF World Championships in Midland, Michigan. He held managerial or Head of Delegation positions on various tours, including the Head of Delegation for the 2004 ISF XI Men's World Championship in Christchurch (New Zealand) and the 2009 ISF XII Men's World Championship in Saskatoon (Canada).

In 1996, Darryl's involvement with softball led to a director's role with Softball Australia. He served as President of Softball Australia from 2000 until 2004 and was significantly involved in softball's transition to the Olympic program. Darryl has represented Softball Australia at ISF Congresses in Tampa (USA) 2001, Kaohsiung (China) 2005, Manila (Philippines) 2007 and Margarita Island (Venezuela) 2009.

Darryl appointed to the ISF Executive in 2010, a position he held until 2017.
