


## **Lindsay Anderson (WA)** **Open Men's Head Coach #2**

Lindsay Anderson captained the first Australian Men's team at the 1988 Men's World Championship in Saskatoon, Canada. He returned in 1991 as the Open Men's Head Coach to face off against the powerful New Zealand team in an eight-match Test Series.



Four Test matches were played in Perth and four in Sydney. New Zealand dominated the series, winning all eight Test matches. The Australian team fielded 25 different players to give them international experience and to begin the selection process for the 1992 Men's World Championship to be held in the Philippines.

In 1992, in pre-championship matches, Australia went down three times to New Zealand but shared one win apiece with Japan. Showing steady improvement at the World Championship, the Australian Men won six of their eight round robin matches, not enough to contest the playoffs but enough to earn fifth place overall. Their performance was particularly meritorious given that their only losses were to the two top placegetters.
