

Myrtle Edwards (Vic) * Player number # 4 Coach number # 2 Softball Australia umpire # AA 7 21 games for Australia

As a coach, Myrtle Edwards was known as an extremely hard task master! Players were left in no doubt if performances didn't meet her expectations. On one tour of South Africa, Myrtle sent the team



on a warm-up run and was extremely agitated when the players didn't return. When she finally tracked them down they were all laying on the ground gasping for air. They had been affected by the high altitude.

Myrtle was a very talented sports woman and was named captain of the Australian Women's team from 1949 – 1952. In 1953 she took over the Head Coach position.

Myrtle was the Australian Open Women's Head Coach for a period of 25 years, coaching 165 games and attending four Women's World Championships.

Under Myrtle's guidance, the Australian Women's team won the 1st Women's World Championship, held in Melbourne in 1965 a bronze medal in the 3rd Women's World Championship held in Stratford Connecticut, USA.

Myrtle also played international women's cricket. If Myrtle went missing on tour, she could usually be found at a local cricket game.

Myrtle was inducted into the Softball Australia Hall of Fame in 1985 and ISF Hall of Fame in 1987.
