

# **SOUTH AUSTRALIAN ROADMAP FOR EASING COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS**

STEP 1 - FROM 11 MAY

## **Caravan parks and camping grounds – Step 1 Fact Sheet**

### **Situation from 11 May 2020**

Caravan parks and camping sites (whether associated with caravan parks or located in national or state parks) can provide accommodation, despite the restrictions on some businesses and activities that are currently in force.

From 11 May 2020, non-essential regional travel within South Australia is encouraged, which may result in more people staying in caravan parks and camping grounds.

Caravan parks and associated camping grounds:

#### **Must:**

- ***Limit the number of people on site to 1 person per 4 square metres (density requirement)***
- ***Limit any gatherings on site to a maximum of 10 attendees***
- ***For swimming pools or play equipment on site, follow the requirements that apply to public facilities (including density and maximum user numbers)***

#### **Should:**

- ***Observe, and encourage observing of, social distancing (1.5 metres rule)***
- ***Facilitate good hand and respiratory hygiene, as much as possible***
- ***Frequently clean and disinfect facilities, including shared kitchens and bathrooms***
- ***Implement signage to support compliance with current restrictions and advice***

Operators and users of camp grounds in national and state parks should follow the above requirements as much as possible, recognising that cleaning and disinfection of share facilities is unlikely to occur on a frequent basis.

## **More information**

### **Density requirement**

There must be no more than one person per four square metres on site at any time. The maximum number of people allowed on site can be calculated by dividing the total area by four.

### **Limit gatherings**

More than 10 people can be on site in total and this limitation also does not apply to gatherings by members of the same household. However, operators should not organise activities involving more than 10 attendees and should discourage gatherings of this size in communal areas.

### **Play equipment and swimming pools**

Swimming pools and play equipment at caravan parks can remain open, with the same requirements as apply to public facilities. This includes a maximum of 10 people using a play areas or a swimming pool at any time.

### **Social distancing**

Observe, and encourage attendees to adhere to, social distancing principles, requiring everyone to try to maintain at least 1.5 metres physical distance between one another at all times.

### **Good hygiene**

Adopt, and encourage adoption of, good hand and respiratory (coughing and sneezing) hygiene practices.

### **Environmental cleaning disinfection**

Frequent environmental cleaning and disinfection should be undertaken in line with health advice available from SA Health and the Australian Department of Health.

### **Implement signage**

To support compliance with current restrictions and advice, it is advisable to implement signage to inform patrons of restrictions, recommendations and health advice. Where appropriate, floor markings can help to remind users of social distancing.
