
February Scenario Challenge –

B2 hits a 3 base hit to left field. B3 hit a grounder to 3rd base field. The 3rd base fielder does not make a play at 1st base on the batter but hold the ball to stop B2 at 3rd base from scoring.

B4 receive a pitched strike, B3 precedes to 2nd base, the catcher throws the ball to shortstop (no attempt to get the out), B2 takes off for home on the throw, shortstop throws to catcher for the tag out at home. B3 continues to 3rd base. The catcher throws to 3rd base fielder for the tag out.

How would you record the play?

Answer –



May Scenario Challenge -

Thank you, Gayle Ray from Redcliffe, for this scenario. She asks how you would score it – Runner on 3rd base.

Batter had a dropped 3rd strike.

Catcher threw to 3rd to try and get the runner out, but he got back to base safe.

3rd base player threw to 1st base and got the batter/runner out.

On the throw from 3rd to 1st base the runner on 3rd ran home safely.

Updates on Scoring Levels Requirements

CHANGES TO LEVEL 2 REQUIREMENTS

"A recent review of the Level 2 manual and lecture material conducted by the SQ Scoring Committee (SQSC) has revealed some changes which may have escaped notice of lecturers and Level 2 candidates. These are:


- Extension of Put Outs, Assists and Errors to the top of the page belong in Level 3. The PO, A, E area has been removed from the top of the Level 2 Exam Score Sheets – no longer required in Level 2.
- Counting the Strikes, Balls and Fouls for each innings at the bottom of the score sheet also belong in Level 3. The S, B, F area has been removed from the bottom of the Level 2 Exam Score Sheets – no longer required in Level 2.
- In Level 2, the name and position of the DP are written in Green. No other green annotation is required for the DP. The purpose of keeping the DP in green in the line-up is to minimise the possibility of having the Flex bat for any player other than the DP.

Recent decisions by the National Scoring Committee (NSC) and State Directors have also impacted on Level 2.

- Batting Out of Order will now receive major attention in Level 2 lecturers. Handling it correctly is now expected of Level 2 scorers.
- Caught Stealing(CS) and Pick Off (PK) symbols are not required in Level 2 but are part of Level 3.
- Sacrifice Hits and Sacrifice Flies remain part of Level 2.
- The timing of changes will ALWAYS be indicated in the format Innings/Batter No – for example – T6/5

NSC is working on a new Level 2 manual to reflect all these changes.

SCORER'S PROFILE - THE JACKA FAMILY - BARRY, CLARE and CHRISTINE

We are all familiar with the contribution that Christine Jacka, our Scoring Social Media Officer continues to make in local softball, but memory of her family's influence is fading as newer generations come forward to meet new challenges in our sport.

Barry Jacka and his family were transferred from Melbourne to Katherine (N.T.) to serve with RAAF 5 Airfield Construction Squadron at Tindal. On discharge, the family remained in Katherine and played their part in pioneering Softball and Baseball in the community. They learnt, along with the town and all that was necessary to conduct the games.

In 1974, C.S.I.R.O. transferred the family to Brisbane where they chose to live in Jindalee and they all joined the Jaguars in the Brisbane Softball Association.

Barry's wife, Clare, coached Jaguars teams and progressed to score for the Jaguars A grade team, Brisbane Junior and Senior teams at State Championships. She also represented

Queensland from 1984 to 1992 scoring for the Open Women's and Under 19 Women's team. Clare went onto to score for Australia.

Barry coached junior and senior Jaguars teams and scored for twenty-three Brisbane representative teams at Junior and Senior Women's State Championships. This included Brisbane's first Men's team (which he also helped select).

Barry scored for Under 16 Girls, Under 19 Women's and Open Women's State Teams, eighteen times. An outstanding contribution to Softball Queensland.

Barry went on to score for the Australian Women's team in 1989. Also in the photo below are fellow Queenslanders: Jenny Andrews, Helen Strauss, Maria Kosenko and Kerrilyn Bichel-Hoger.



In 2000, both Clare and Barry were awarded the Australian Sports Medal for their services to Softball.

Barry also replaced the leader of the Queensland Scoring Committee because it was the only such organisation, he was appointed the chair of the inaugural Australian Scorers Committee. This committee was charged with standardising scoring and formalising accreditation. Barry's contribution was the design and creation of a standard scorebook which remained in use for many years.

Tournaments were often family gatherings as his daughters, Christine, Wendy, and Susan, also made their contributions as players and officials.
