Chair of the Board

This time last year, no-one would have predicted the year ahead - so I want to start this communication by saying that I am immensely proud of what we have done as a TT community and what we achieved in 2020.

As with any business or sporting organisation we can often get caught up in the day-day activities and do not sit back and reflect on what we have achieved – particularly in this period of significant disruption.

An agile response to COVID-19

- Provided leadership and regular updates in relation to COVID-19 with over 20 communications released and Zoom meetings held with our TT community and external partners
- Chair of Board was appointed as a member of ORS&R COVID-19 taskforce to provide feedback on the COVID-19 impact and a path forward for all sports

Operational efficiency

- Transitioned to a new website – the website is more contemporary and allows us to scale up operations with future add-on modules
- Piloted a new TTSA Winter Pennant scoring and laddering system that provides near real time data on teams, individual players and match status
- Created a practical user guide/manual (specific for TT) for Star Club accreditation that will be rolled out in 2021
- Maintained regular Board meetings to ensure the continuity of decision making and impact assessment

Recognition and financial security

- Undertook a comprehensive review of membership levels across SA with a view of providing a simpler and more transparent fee structure whilst ensuring a cost effective and player focussed benefit program
- Negotiated in a collaborative manner with our National Federation to introduce a new Social Membership category that had a cost savings to our members
- Continued to manage/oversee member disputes at the local level
- Waived the affiliation fee for all TTSA affiliates in 2020
- Reduced player registration fees (~60-70%) in recognition of the impact on COVID-19 on players and affiliates in 2020

Our Sport

- Held junior, para, youth, senior and veterans State Titles to crown State Champions (if not held that would be first time since WW2 that a state champion has not been awarded)
- Maintained our Social Media presence
- Outsourced the running of the Smash Hits program in a year of significant disruption for player programs
- Finalised the 2020-2022 Strategic Plan that will provide a platform for 2021+
- Continued to build on our relationships within our network
- Maintained an agile response to the ongoing commitment to TTSA squads (High Performance, Development and Emerging Athletes and Para programs)
- Supported individual clubs with grant applications
- Supported and advocated for TTA (National Federation) programs such as Spinneroos, Corporate Cup and Sporting Schools

What is the collective impact?

Offsetting the above, and due to COVID-19, TTSA has seen:

- ~50% reduction in affiliate numbers
- waiving of 2020 affiliation fees for all affiliates registered with TTSA in the prior year (2019)
- ~60% reduction in player registrations (couple this with the reduced player registration and affiliation fees the financial impact is significant)
- reduced grant income from OSR&S.

None of the above would have been foreseen by anyone – the impact across the community is significant and continues to be felt by everyone and the TTSA Board believes that it has been cognisant of the impact on the community during the year and as the community starts to re-emerge from the pandemic.

People

At the core of our sport are the people – we punch well above our weight in terms of expertise, skill and commitment to the sport – the energy and willingness of our TT community to be agile in this environment is a credit to you all!

Having said that, we appreciate that not everyone will agree with the decisions that the TTSA Board makes however you can be guaranteed that appropriate due diligence and care has been taken prior to any decision being made that impacts on a member, members, clubs/affiliates or the TT community in general. This is also the beauty of our governance structure, for those that want to positively influence and build and grow the sport at all levels there are always opportunities to get involved with TTSA at the board or committee level!

It would be remiss of me in such an unusual year not to mention and thank the TTSA Board members of Greg Bungey, Cynthia Langley OAM, Kay Crowell, Michal Zhang, Lenno Stevels, Geoff Langhans and Laurette Norton.

There were times this year when the going has been tough – as you would all have appreciated yourselves – however I am very proud of how we have navigated through this period as a collective group.

Social Media/Starclub

2020! We are all completely aware how much of a challenging time the last year has been. What isn't as clear is how much work goes on behind the scenes researching, planning and adapting to such a dynamic environment with everchanging regulations and constraints. I am grateful of my fellow Directors and the broader table tennis community for their efforts in making the most a perhaps the most difficult year many of us have ever experienced.

TTSA Winter Pennant is the pinnacle of club competition in the state and the decision to cancel the 2020 season was not made lightly. In the lead up to this unfortunate but necessary decision, I worked extensively with Director Lenno Stevels planning ever-evolving ideas about how a winter season might look including viability and risk analysis. Our work was not only limited to the hopeful running of a winter season, but also alternatives with the goal to keep interclub engagement alive. The Board made the call to cancel the season as promptly as possible when our last hopes of interclub competition were extinguished to provide our Affiliates with as much time as possible to formulate their own plans within government restrictions. It was most pleasing to see how responsive and proficient many Affiliates were which enabled play at varying levels to be conducted. The table tennis community should hold its head high for its endeavor this year!

Another significant undertaking of mine this year was the investigation of how the South Australian Government STARCLUB initiative could benefit table tennis in the state including a pilot through the program and creating a table tennis specific accreditation support guide for rollout in 2021. The program undoubtedly has merit for our clubs and I look forward to supporting them through the process.

TTSA's social media presence and engagement continues to grow with over 1400 followers of our Facebook page. As well as being a platform to assist the many enquiries received on the TTSA page, it represents an opportunity for promotion and I would like to extend an invitation to our Affiliates to utilise our social media reach in the spruiking of events and similar. Never hesitate to get in touch with any queries about how we can assist you.

2020 may have finished but the impacts of COVID-19 have not and we must maintain our diligence in what will likely be another challenging year. Thank you to everyone involved in our wonderful sport for your efforts and understanding.

The South Australian Table Tennis Officiating Council (SATTOC) organized and ran a very successful State Umpire (Level 2) training course at the Maid of Auckland Hotel (Conference Room) on Sunday, 16th August 2020. Thanks go to Dr Wing Au and Lenore Roder for doing an excellent job in presenting the course on the day. Both Wing and Lenore are International Umpires (Level 4). The written exam and oral exam was also conducted and marked by Dr Wing Au (assisted by Lenore Roder).

There were 11 candidates who enrolled with one candidate who unfortunately had to withdraw due to family & business commitments. Overall, eight candidates have completed all components of the course successfully, and two have yet to complete their practicum. The two candidates who need to complete the practicum will do this in 2021.

This is an outstanding result to have 10 new State Umpires able to assist in the officiating of table tennis events during 2021 and into the future.

Membership

A great deal of the work that I have done during 2020 is in undertaking and completing the project of the establishment of the TTSA new website.

Our former website had been developed and maintained over the last few years by our web administrator, Damien Maddigan, who has done an excellent job. There were contemporary changes that have emerged such as establishing a member database that complies with the National Database specifications and the need for an online competitions module to manage our TTSA Winter Pennant Competition that our old website could not accommodate.

Table Tennis Australia obtained from Sport Australia 'One Management' funding in 2019 to establish a National Membership Database. TTA decided that this database would be established on the revolutioniseSPORT platform and ideally that all States would be on the same platform. This goal was achieved during 2020 with all States and Territories now using revolutioniseSPORT.

The revolutioniseSPORT website is a sports management platform that has been tailored to Table Tennis with a strong IT support team that provide ongoing support in addition to providing a more contemporary look and feel with the ability to scale up operations with future add-on modules. A further advantage is that administration of the site could be shared, that is we would not be reliant upon one person. revolutioniseSPORT is also used by many other sports in Australia.

The funding provided by Sport Australia was used to pay for each State and Territory to establish websites with revolutioniseSPORT and to migrate their data. The TTSA Board decided in early 2020 that they would move away from our former website and undertake a project to establish a new website with revolutioniseSPORT. The TTSA domain name of www.tabletennissa.org.au remains and is used by the new site.

The project to move to the new revolutioniseSPORT based website commenced in early May 2020 with the new website going live on the 3rd July 2020.

The next stage of the project happening in 2021 is to fully understand the attributes of the new website, to determine what attributes TTSA may use and to make improvements in the way information is currently presented and to bring that information on the website up to date.

Apart from viewing the site, the first interaction members will have with the new site is a welcome email that they will receive once they are registered with TTSA by their Club/Association. This email will provide a login and password which will allow members to view and update their personal information that has been provided by their Club/Association.

TTSA, TTA and revolutioniseSPORT all have privacy policies and members may be assured that membership data will never be shared with or sold to any third party.

Event Management

I did put out the Calendar early in the year, but as the COVID-19 struck the World and Australia included, all tournaments and competitions throughout the World and in all States of Australia had to be cancelled.

With restrictions brought into each state, clubs needed to be shut down on occasions and players could not train or practice.

A couple of times there were some time available for our State Body to conduct a couple of tournaments. The State Open & Youth, the State Junior and State Veterans tournaments. I thank Paton Wilson from Brighton Club for conducting these tournaments for me, as I had been ill throughout the year.

For 2021, TTA has altered the age groups for the National junior events, which means that the states need to do the same thing. The age groups will be U/19, U/17, U/15, U/13, U/11. I will need to adjust the perpetual trophies and purchase some new ones.

At the moment, our program is progressing well, but Clubs and Associations will need to follow the Covid-19 restrictions, set by the Government.

I wish you well for this coming year and I thank the many people who have assisted me throughout the season.

Significant Events

TTA Hall of Fame (Veterans)

TTA Hall of Fame (Veterans) took place during the Closing Function of the 2019 National Veterans Championships on Saturday 19 October in Adelaide 2019 with the following SA inductees:

- Betty Bird
- Kay Crowell

Both Betty and Kay have been outstanding contributors to Table Tennis in Australia and their records as Veterans players are unrivalled. Their induction into the TTA Hall of Fame (Veterans) provides outstanding recognition for the quality and quantity of their involvement in our great game over a long period of time.

TTA Player of The Year Award

Paralympic silver medallist Sam von Einem has capped off his best international season to date, winning Table Tennis Australia's (TTA's) Arthur Wilks Award as the 2020 Australian Para Player of the Year.

The 25-year-old was presented the award after ending the assessment period with a swag of medals and world class performances.

Highlights for von Einem include the 2019 Slovenian Para Open, where he won bronze in the Class 11 Men's Team event, claiming two gold medals at the 2019 Japan Para Open in the Class 11 Men's Singles and Class 11 Men's Team events, three medals at the 2019 INAS Global Games including gold in the Class 11 Men's Singles and silver in the Class 11 Men's Teams and bronze in the INASS II-1 Men's Doubles, and finally the 2020 Spain Para Open where he took home bronze in the Class 11 Men's Singles.

This is the third time von Einem has won this prestigious award after previously being a recipient in 2014 and 2016.

Under normal circumstances the assessment period would have been from immediately after the 2019 National Para Championships, until completion of the 2020 National Para Championships. However, with COVID-19 causing the cancellation of the event this year, TTA and the National Selection Panel determined that presenting the award at the end of 2020 was the most appropriate way forward.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The consolidated financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act (SA) 1985*. The Board has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The consolidated financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a) Income Tax

In accordance with the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*, the association is exempt from Income Tax.

b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

c) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

d) Property, Plant and Equipment

Asset purchases have historically been recognised as capital items on the balance sheet and depreciated over their useful life as determined by the board. From the 2018 year, minor equipment is being expensed in the year of purchase. This equipment has limited commercial value once used and will be used over a number of years by the Association.

e) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

f) Grant Revenue

Grant Revenue represents funds received from the Office of Recreation, Sport and Racing and has been accounted for on a Cash basis as the entity obtains control of these funds at the time of receipt.

g) Consolidation

Table Tennis South Australia Incorporated provides financial assistance to Australian Championships (ABN: 90 095 656 709), an unincorporated entity operated by Table Tennis South Australia Incorporated to manage the income and expenditure relating to various travel and accommodation costs of State players. The intention is that this entity should collect funds from players involved and pay suppliers on their behalf. There is often a timing difference between the supplier payments and the players forwarding the funds. In these situations, funds from Table Tennis South Australia are transferred to enable these payments. As at 31st December 2020, Table Tennis South Australia Incorporated was owed \$48,236 (\$54,257 in 2019) by Australian Championships.

The consolidated financial statements summarise the income and the financial positions of both Table Tennis South Australia and Australian Championships as at 31 December 2020.
