## OUR TOP PICKS

- Visit the Swan Valley WA's oldest wine region, located a 25-minute drive from Perth city. There's more than 150 attractions ranging from wineries to providores to breweries, with Chenin Blanc, Verdelho, Shiraz and fortifieds among the speciality premium wines produced.
- Kings Park and Botanic Garden, located on the CBD's doorstep, is the spot for picturesque views over the city and the Swan River, At 400 hectares, it is one of the largest inner city parks in the world and larger than New York's Central Park
- The city's newest public precinct, Yagan Square, is a hub of activity day and night with bars, events, a spectacular lighting installation and large screen; plus a market hall with more than 20 different eateries to tempt your tastebuds.
- No visit to Perth is complete without spending time in the eclectic port city of **Fremantle**. A short drive, train ride or river cruise from the CBD, 'Freo' as it's known to locals, is the perfect blend of old and new with museums, pubs, cool cafes and markets.
- Make your way to one of the 19 pristine metropolitan beaches lining Perth's coastline and find your own slice of white sand to relax and enjoy one of WA's iconic Indian Ocean sunsets. Surfers head to Scarborough and Trigg, while swimmers and stand-up paddle boarders cool off at Cottesloe, or Mettam's Pool.
- Perth's idyllic island playground, Rottnest Island, can be reached in just a short 30-minute ferry ride from the mainland. On its shores, 63 stunning beaches, 20 beautiful bays and many coral reefs and wrecks invite you to enjoy some of Australia's finest swimming spots, snorkel trails and surf breaks. It's also here you'll find the world's happiest animal, the famous quokka.
