3.0 The Event

The event will be round 2 of the NECC Khanacross championship to be conducted at the Carboor Hall Reserve on the 23rd May 2021.

4.0 Description of competition

The event is a Khanacross on unsealed surface, it is not a speed event so the use of bollards, witches' hats etc will be used to restrict the longer straights
Some stop / go garages could also be part of the course.
No Rally / Off road or aggressive tyres will be allowed.

7.0 Classes

Class A - 2wd production Vehicles up to 1300cc

Class B - 2wd production Vehicles 1300cc to 1600cc

Class C - 2wd production Vehicles 1600cc to 2000cc

Class D - 2wd production Vehicles 2000cc to 3000cc

Class E - 2wd production Vehicles above 3000cc

Class F - 4H vehicle motorkhans specials, 4WD, AWD

Class J – Juniors under 14 and under 18

8.0 Abandonment

Event Organisers reserve the right to cancel, abandon or postpone the event in accordance with The AASA National Competition Rules.

9.0 Alcohol, Drugs and other substances

Any AASA licence holder or an official's licence issued by the AASA (or equivalent licenced issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) will be subject to penalties as recommended by the AASA. Consumption of alcohol is totally banned.

10. Minimum Safety Requirements

11.1. Vehicles, all vehicles must comply with the AASA regulations for motor vehicles

11.2. Occupants, all junior competitors must have an adult present.

11.3 Scrutiny – All vehicles must be scrutineered prior to starting the event.

11. Starting Order and Driver Briefing

12.1 Start order will be determined by the Clerk of Course, Followed by a drivers briefing at 9:am

12. Scoring

13.1 Timing of runs will be by hand held stopwatches, in the event of a non-timed run a rerun can be awarded

Wrong Direction

Slowest time plus five (5) seconds

Failure to complete a test

Slowest time plus five (5) seconds

Running out of order without permission

Slowest time plus five (5) seconds

Failure to stop in a mid-course garage

Slowest time plus five (5) seconds

Failing to stop completely at finish

Slowest time plus five (5) seconds

Striking a course marker/ flag

Five (5) seconds per marker

Failure to attempt a test

Slowest time plus ten (10) seconds

14. Club Car

14.1. Use of the club cars



Juniors under the age of 18 can use the club free of charge, but must be accompanied by an adult.

14.2. Fees for seniors

Any senior wishing to use the club car must pay a fee of \$25.00 per day.

14.3 Any person found to be abusing the club car will be disqualified.

16. Crew conduct

16.1. Failure to act in a manner befitting the sport, as deemed by the Organisers and/or Stewards of the Event, will result in the Crew being charged and penalties issued
