Please note that due to a venue clash, we are unable to offer weapons control on Thursday night. We have adjusted the times to compensate. To avoid queues, please stick to the times below. We will have a full weapons control team every morning.

Friday: 7th September

Sabre only from 2.00pm men's foil & women's epee, from 3pm All weapons from 5pm until 8.00pm

Saturday: 8th September

Men's foil from 7.30am Women's epee from 8.30am All weapons from 9.00am

Sunday: 9th September

Men's epee from 7.30am Women's foil from 8.30am All weapons from 9am

Competition Requirements:

Masks:

350N minimum. A secondary strap is required on Leon Paul X-change masks. Foil Bibs ARE required. Elastic mask straps must be in good condition.

Gloves:

Gloves MUST NOT have a wire hole in them. Velcro must come all the way up to the seam of the wrist,

Wires:

Bayonet Wires are accepted. Curly mask wires are NOT accepted for any weapon.

Clothing:

A minimum of 350N breeches must be worn.

Over the chest a minimum of 1150N must be worn. This can be made up of either 800N plastron and 350N jacket, or 350N plastron and 800N jacket.

Knee length socks and appropriate shoes are required. Chest protectors are compulsory for women.

Weapons:

Sabre: S2000 Blades Required.

Foil: FIE Blades Required.

Epee: FIE Blades Required.

SR-71 Blades stamped between 2013 and 2015 and V Profile Blades without a unique serial code are banned from all NZ competitions.

Venue Specific Information:

- 1. Fencing bags are to be stored in the designated area.
- 2. There is to be NO blade contact with the wooden floor. There will be carpet squares at the ends of all pistes to straighten blades on. A blade being whacked on the floor in frustration will not be tolerated and could also incur a fine to cover damages.
