# Humpybong WinterBash incorporating the Marathon 2019 NOTICE OF RACE

- (NP) denotes that a breach of this rule will not be grounds for protest by boat.
- **(DP)** denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the Jury and may be less than disqualification.
- **(SP)** denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee without a hearing.

The organising authority is Humpybong Yacht Club.

#### 1 Rules:

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 The prescriptions of Australian Sailing shall apply.
- 1.3 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

#### 2 (DP) Advertising and Bow Numbers:

1.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority.

#### 3 Eligibility and Entry:

- 1.2. The regatta is open to all classes of yacht with either a yardstick or that have a valid measurement certificate or rating. For trailable yachts, the Trailable Conversion factor will be used. Eligible boats may enter by using the on-line entry system on the HYC web page at http://hyc.net.au or the HYC Facebook page until 5pm Thursday 25th July 2019.Late entries may be made in person at the HYC clubhouse up until two hours before the race briefing and will incur a late entry fee of an extra \$10.
- 1.3. All members of the crew must be a financial member of a yacht club affiliated with Australia Sailing and have a valid Australian Sailing Sailor Identification Number. Visiting International crews may use written evidence from their equivalent National Authority in lieu.











1.4. Entrants under the age of 18 years as at 27th July 2019 will be required lodge a signed copy either on line at <a href="mailto:racing@hyc.net.au">racing@hyc.net.au</a> or by handing it in prior to the first race briefing

#### 4 Entry Fees:

1.5. Required fees are as follows:

	Boats with more than three crew entered before 5:00pm on Thursday 25 <sup>th</sup> July 2019.	\$80
Seniors:	Boats with more than three crew entered after 5:00pm on Thursday 25 <sup>th</sup> July 2019	\$90
	Boats with less than three crew entered before 5:00pm on Thursday 25 <sup>th</sup> July 2019	\$70
	Boats with less than three crew entered after 5:00pm on Thursday 25 <sup>th</sup> July 2019	\$80
Juniors	per boat	\$35

- 1.6. In the event of cancellation of one day's racing, a refund of \$25 for seniors and \$15 for juniors will be made. A full refund will be made in the event of the cancellation of both days of the regatta.
- 1.7. If the entry is cancelled by the competitor, the entry fee will be funded as follows
  - 1.7.1. Three or more weeks before the event 50%
  - 1.7.2. Less than three weeks before the event -0%

5.2 Competitors will be notified at 1700hrs on the evening before, of the time of first signal on the next day taking into account 5.1.

#### 6 Junior Racing

- 6.1 Junior racing will be conducted separately inshore of the open course to a different format:
  - 6.1.1 Day one: the competitors will participate in up to seven short triangular course races
  - 6.1.2 Day Two: competitors will participate in three one hour endurance races on the inshore course.

#### 7 (DP)(NP) Equipment and Measurement:

- 7.1 All boats shall comply with class requirements where applicable.
  - 7.1.1 No measurement beyond spot checking performed by the race committee will take place during the event.
- 7.2 In the event of damage, replacement equipment may only be substituted with written permission of the Race Committee.
- 7.3 Sailing Instructions:
- 7.4 The sailing instructions will be available on line no later than 5pm Thursday 25<sup>h</sup> July 2019 on the HYC website or at the race registration desk located upstairs at HYC on Saturday 27th July 2019.

#### 8 Venue:

- 8.1 The regatta site will be the Humpybong Yacht Club, situated at the corner Hornibrook Esp. & Oxley Ave, Woody Point, Qld 4019, and conducted on the waters of Bramble Bay and Moreton Bay.
- 8.2 Competitors wishing to camp on the Club property should advise the Club when submitting their entries before 26<sup>th</sup> July.
- 8.3 Yachts mooring at Woody Point will have access to the Clubhouse showers and facilities during the evening of 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> July.

#### 9 Safety Requirements











- 9.1 The Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 2 off the beach boats shall apply. Section 5.01 Personal Flotation Devices will apply. It is the responsibility of all competitors to ensure that the personal flotation devices comply with a standard equivalent to those listed in the regulations.
- 9.2 The use of helmets for both helm and crew is mandatory during racing for those classes that have so mandated in their Cass rules

#### 10 The Racing Area

10.1 All races will be conducted in the area depicted in the chart below.

Dependent upon classes entering to regatta, the race area may be extended into Decepton Bay or north to Bribie Island to cater for larger yachts.













#### 11 Courses:

- 11.1 The courses will be set out in the sailing instruction to be made available on 25th July and as modified up till 9:00am on the morning of each race
- 11.2 Day One:
  - 11.2.1 All classes will sail two laps of a triangular course with 1000m legs set in the vicinity of Bramble Bay
- 11.3 Day Two:
  - 11.3.1 Courses for each Division will be set according to the forecast wind and sea conditions with a view to the race duration being 5 hours maximum for all classes and appropriate for the experience and skills of the entrants.

#### 12 Jury











12.1 A qualified Jury will be constituted in accordance with "Addendum A – Australian Sailing policy on the denial of the right of appeals". Decisions of the jury will be final, in accordance with RRS Rule 70.5.

#### 13 Scoring:

- 13.1 The low point scoring system A4 will apply
- 13.2 Day One: three races will be sailed with the accumulated times adjusted to handicap to determine the overall winner of the first day
- Day Two: one race sailed in divisions; each division determined on 27<sup>th</sup> July by number of competitors and the course to be sailed by that class of yacht taking into account the weather and tides. The times shall be adjusted to handicap to determine the overall winner of the marathon by division..
- 13.4 Race results for each day shall be weighted as follows to determine the overall winner of the WinterBash regatta for each division:
  - 13.4.1 Around the can races actual race score
  - 13.4.2 Marathon 3 times the race score
  - 13.4.3 The winner shall be the boat with the lowest aggregate points score

#### 14 Support Boats and Personnel

- 14.1 All support boats shall be registered with the Organising Authority and will be required to comply with local legislation and event support boat regulations. The Organising Authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at their sole discretion
- 14.2 All support boats shall keep to leeward of the start line and its extensions between the preparatory signal and the start signals and more than 100 metres clear of any competing boat or mark of the course, between the start signal and the finish of the last boat, except when asked to assist by the Race Committee.
- 14.3 Only coaches, who hold, as a minimum, current Yachting Australia recognised Coach / Instructor Accreditation, or an equivalent international qualification, are authorised to go afloat in a coach boat within the course area.
- 14.4 Non-registered coaches, parents, private and spectator craft must remain more than 250 meters outside the entire course area and not receive the above benefits.

#### 15 Prizes:

- 15.1 Prizes will be awarded to the helmsman and crew of the top finishing boats.
- 15.2 The committee may award more prizes at their discretion











#### 16 Disclaimer of Liability:

- 16.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- The Humpybong Yacht Club Inc. and all parties involved in the organisation of events are not responsible for the seaworthiness, or adequacy of a boat whose entry is accepted. In accordance with RRS Rule 76 the Humpybong Yacht Club Inc. reserves the right to refuse any entry.

#### 17 Insurance

17.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10 million per event or the equivalent.

#### 18 Media Rights, Cameras and Electronic Equipment

- 18.1 By participating in the event, competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority, and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion
- Any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 18.3 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment and positioning equipment as specified by the Organizing Authorities.
