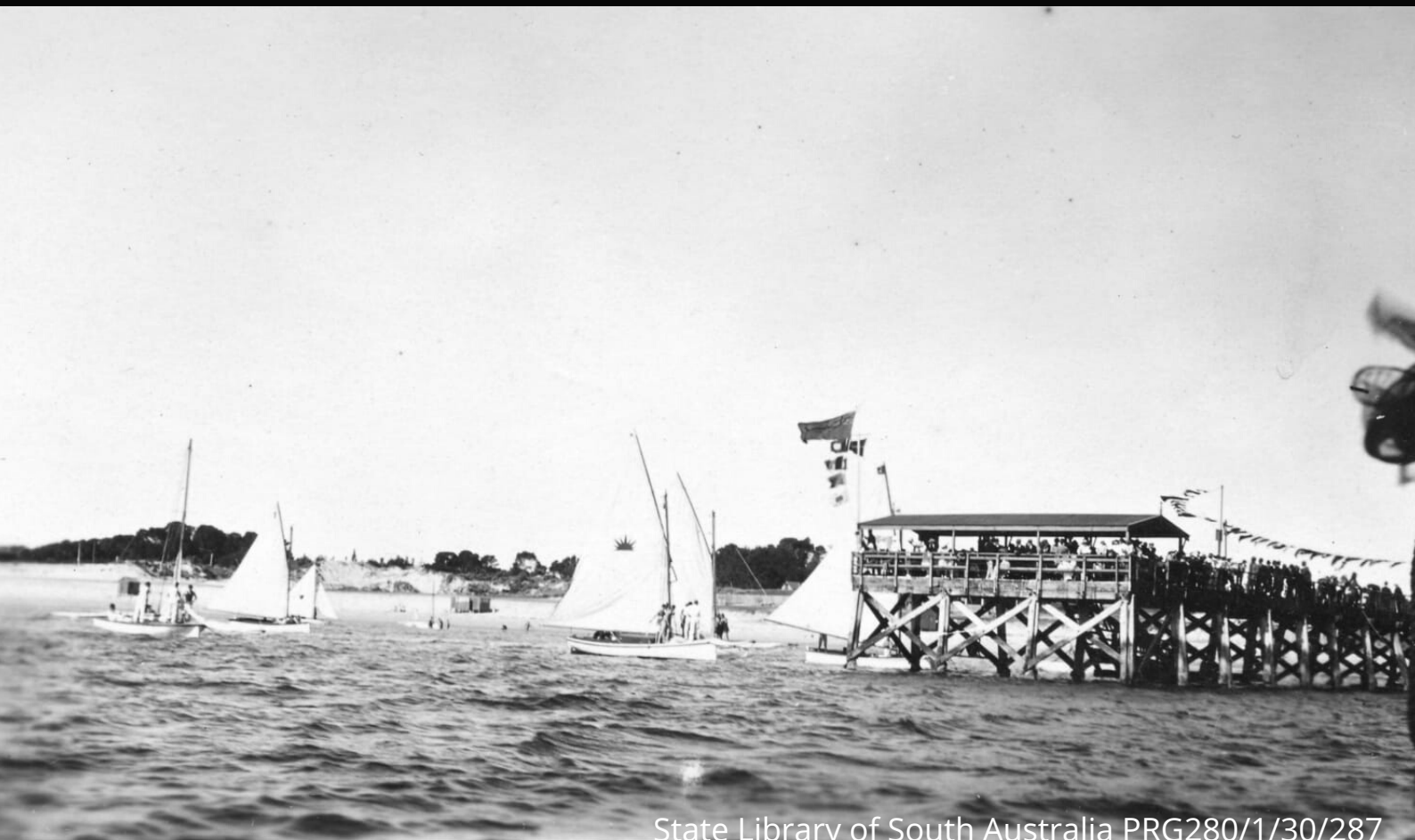

CENTENARY REGATTA SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

8th and 9th February 2020

Brighton & Seacliff Yacht Club

The Organising Authority is **Brighton & Seacliff Yacht Club Inc.** and the regatta will be conducted at **Brighton & Seacliff Yacht Club** in Adelaide, South Australia.

Location: 246 Esplanade, Seacliff SA 5049

1.0 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Australian Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Australian Sailing Special Regulation Part 2 Off the Beach Boats will apply (DP).
- 1.3 The Sailing Instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and Supplementary Sailing Instructions that will be on the official notice board located on the western window of the Lower Deck.
- 1.4 If there is a conflict between the NOR and the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions will take precedence.

2.0 NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official race notice board on the western window of the Lower Deck.

3.0 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted 1 hour before it will take effect, except any change in the schedule of the races will be posted by the end of the protest time or 1800 hours, whichever is the latter, on the day before it will take effect.

4.0 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole on the bridge.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP. This changes Race Signal AP.

5.1 1 race is scheduled on Saturday, 8th February (as a standalone event) to follow a heritage race course format. 2 races are scheduled for Sunday, 9th February which will be scored separately from Day 1.

5.2 No warning signal will be made later than 16:00 hrs on Sunday, 9th February, 2020.

6.0 VENUE/RACING AREA

6.1 Racing will be conducted in the waters of the Gulf of St. Vincent off the Brighton & Seacliff Yacht Club, generally between the Brighton Jetty, B&SYC and 1 nm off shore.

7.0 COURSES

7.1 Courses will be displayed on the course board in the Lower Deck. Marks of the course will be displayed on the course board on the Lower Deck.

8.0 THE START

8.1 Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26 with the Warning Signal made 5 minutes before the Starting Signal.

8.2 The starting line on Day 1 will be an imaginary line between the flagpole on the Brighton Jetty (Port End) displaying an orange flag and a staff on a buoy (Starboard End) displaying an orange flag. There will be a clearance marker between the Jetty flag pole and the starboard end orange flag buoy. Boats cannot start between this clearance marker and the Jetty.

8.3 The starting line on Day 2 will be an imaginary line between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Committee Vessel at the starboard end and a buoy with a staff displaying an orange flag at the port end.

9.0 THE FINISH

9.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Committee Vessel at the starboard end and a buoy with a staff displaying an orange flag at the port end.

10.0 TIME LIMIT

10.1 Day 1
The time limit for racing on Day 1 shall be 2 hours for all classes. Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat of their respective division sails the course and finishes will be scored 'Did Not Finish' (DNF) – this changes RRS 35.

10.2 Day 2
The time limit for Racing on Day 2 shall be 1.5 hours. Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat of their respective division sails the course and finishes will be scored 'Did Not Finish' (DNF) – this changes Rule 35.

11.0 SHORTEN COURSE

11.1 RRS 32 shall apply.

12.0 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

12.1 Protest forms will be available at the Sign Off Desk and protests shall be delivered to the Race Officer within 60 minutes after the time of the last boats finish in the last race of the day.

12.2 Notices of protests by the Race Committee will be posted on the official notice board to inform boats under RRS 61.1.

12.3 Decisions of the Protest Committee will be final as in RRS 70.5.

13.0 SCORING

13.1 Low Point System will be used.

13.2 Scoring will be based on yardstick using each boat's elapsed time for the following divisions:

- Division 1 Junior Classes
- Division 2 Windsurfers
- Division 3 Trailerable Yachts, Keel and Classic Keel Fleet
- Division 4 Classic Dinghy Fleet
- Division 5 Intermediate Classes
- Division 6 Senior Classes

13.3 Day 1 – 1 race will constitute a series.

Day 2 – 2 races will constitute a series and both races shall count.

14.0 SAFETY

14.1 For each race session each boat intending to race shall 'sign on' by signing the race sign on form located in the Lower Deck no later than 15 minutes prior to the first warning signal. Failure to comply may result in a boat being scored Did Not Compete (DNC) for the race or races without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1.

14.2 All boats not finishing shall sign Did Not Finish (DNF) on the race 'sign off' sheet upon returning to the shore, no later than the end of protest time for that day.

14.3 All boats finishing shall sign Finish (Fin) on the race 'sign off' sheet upon returning to the shore, no later than the end of protest time for that day. Failure to comply may result in a boat being scored Did Not Finish (DNF) for the race or races without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1.

14.4 All Competitors shall wear personal flotation devices, which are in good condition and are in accordance with the specifications issued or approved by a National Authority affiliated to World Sailing, or a standards organisation, or certification authority, recognised for the purpose by its respective government. Attention is drawn to Fundamental Rule 1.2.

15.0 PRIZES

15.1 Prizes will be awarded in accordance with the NOR.

16.0 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

16.1 It is the Competitor's decision to enter the Brighton & Seacliff Yacht Club's Centenary Regatta or to start in any race. Competitors shall accept that their participation in the Regatta is at their sole exclusive risk in every respect.

By way of entry to the Regatta, Competitors shall indemnify B&SYC Inc., their officers, members, servants and agents in respect of all claims and demands of whatever nature which may be made upon them in connection with or who so ever arising from their participation or intended participation in the Regatta. Competitors attention is drawn to World Sailing Fundamental Rule 4.

17.0 INSURANCE

17.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000 per event or equivalent.

18.0 RIGHT TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

18.1 In participating in this event, a Competitor automatically grants the Organising Authority and the event sponsors the right in perpetuity to make, use and show from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of competition for the said event in which the Competitor participates and in material related to the said event without compensation.
