Fee Structure Review

- In 2018, Australian Sailing introduced a national banded fee structure for affiliation fees.
- At the time, a commitment was made to review this structure on its 3year anniversary. To commence this process, a working group was formed whose purpose was to:
- Review the fee model and consider whether it has met its objectives
- Identify improvements that contribute to better equity, transparency and simplicity
- Identify any impediments for achieving full national implementation by 2022
- Make recommendations to the AS board for any changes









Fee Structure Review

The outcome of the review is that some minor changes have been made to the structure. Key points:

- The total amount of fees will be no greater than the previous version of the structure
- The "implied fee" formula has been replaced with a simplified ranking system to help better allocate clubs to bands with their peers
- Subjective criteria for assisting with allocation to bands now better defined
- The fee allocated to each band has been reviewed and, in most cases, reduced
- All club fees will have a 10% discount from the published band amount to assist the transition to the revised structure
- Review mechanism for hardship remains unchanged
- A national guide will be published for clubs to explain the structure and address FAQ's
- Details will be communicated to clubs in the coming weeks





National Redress Scheme

- National Redress Scheme for Institutional Child Sexual Abuse. Established 1st July 2018
- Developed, as a result of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.
 - Which heard the failings on institutions to appropriately prevent and respond to child sexual abuse and found that sexual abuse can happen in many settings, including within sport and recreation contexts.
- Institutions can join as either individuals or as a group.
- By signing up accepting a certain process and being exonerated from civil action.
- No protection from criminal action.
- Payment up to \$150k, counselling or apology are the types of redress.
- Australian Sailing is making enquiries and learning about the scheme.



- Build the foundation skills, standards and high performance mindset required to be an internationally successful sailor




